

The SFP program in Siena, Italy, offers film and photo students up to 21 credits in their majors.

Students study with local, professional photographer Luciano Valentini, and local filmmaker Carlo Tozzi and other film professionals.

Luciano's advanced digital photo class includes work on studio and on-location lighting, Photoshop, a sunrise photo shoot excursion, and a photo show, among other things.

The final course project is a book.

In Carlo's film production class, students work alongside professionals on screenwriting, make-up, costumes, lighting, etc., all leading to the production of a short fiction film.

This program will encourage you to use your skills in new ways, and is your chance of a lifetime to live and study in a foreign culture, earning credits you need to graduate, such

as:

PHOT 493 - Study Tour (4 credits)
FILM 381 - Cinema italiano (3 credits)
Fiction Film Production (4 credits) - Program Elective
Italian Language (9 credits) - fills Diversity Core
Service Learning (1 credit)

Also planned is a trip to either Cinecittà in Rome or the Centro Sperimentale di Cinematografia
