*SFP ELECTIVES (AT LEAST 4 COURSES, 12-16 CREDITS):

Any courses offered in the School of Film & Photography including THTR 304, MUST 295, MUST 380 and MUST 382, that are *not* serving to fulfill any requirements listed above. Any of the studies or production courses listed above in excess of the number required in each category can be taken as SFP Electives. This requirement is intended to permit Film and Photography students to explore their individual interests in greater depth in one area or more broadly in both areas.

**NON-SFP ELECTIVES (AT LEAST 3 COURSES, 9-12 CREDITS):

Non-SFP Electives are any courses offered outside the School of Film & Photography, not including THTR 304, MUST 295, MUST 380 and MUST 382, that are not serving to fulfill university CORE requirements. This requirement is intended to encourage Film and Photography students to develop an area of knowledge to inform their pursuits as creative artists. Completion of a minor outside of the School of Film and Photography will fulfill this requirement.

FILM GATE REQUIREMENTS:

The Film Option will accept no more than 48 students into the sophomore year. To be eligible, students must pass all required first-year SFP courses (FILM 100IH, 106, 112 & 113IA), WRIT 101 College Writing I, and US University Seminar. Priority for the gate will be determined by the GPA in required first-year SFP courses (FILM 100IH, 106, 112 & 113IA).
